### Did You Know?

- [LBCC regulation 5012.3.\(K\)](#) states that “Electronic recording devices may not be used in the classrooms without the permission of the instructor.” This is reiterated in our [Standard of Student Conduct under campus rule #11](#). In addition, [California Education Code 78907](#) states the following:  
*The use by any person, including a student, of any electronic listening or recording device in any classroom without the prior consent of the instructor is prohibited, except as necessary to provide reasonable auxiliary aids and academic adjustments to disabled students. Any person, other than a student, who willfully violates this section shall be guilty of a misdemeanor. Any student violating this section shall be subject to appropriate disciplinary action.*

### **This Week in Labor History:**

- **On November 9<sup>th</sup>, 1935**, a group of eight progressive unions founded the Committee for Industrial Organization within the American Federation of Labor (AFL). The Committee had several objectives, all of which had been largely ignored or resisted by old-guard AFL leadership: organizing laborers in mass production industries, organizing across racial lines, and establishing workers as an influential voice within Franklin Roosevelt's New Deal coalition. In 1936, unhappy with the challenge posed by the Committee's work to entrenched leadership and tradition, the AFL suspended the unions that had established it the year before. The suspended unions immediately created a new stand-alone labor federation, the Congress of Industrial Organizations, or CIO, that would serve as a hub of progressive labor organizing for several decades. In 1955 the CIO rejoined the AFL, creating what we now refer to as the AFL-CIO. For more, see Robert Zeiger's classic study, [\*The CIO: 1935-1955\*](#).
