This Week in Labor Herstory:

On March 4th, 1933, President Franklin Delano Roosevelt appointed Frances Perkins as the Secretary of Labor. Perkins, who was the first women to serve in a U.S. presidential cabinet, played an important role in shaping key labor legislation during the 1930s, including the National Labor Relations Act and Social Security Act.
